

Install an accessible path to allow access for all users  
Hardcore/cinder path using locally sourced waste materials

Blue Path - 2 metre wide hardcore/cinder path  
Yellow Path - 1.5 metre wide board walk

Boggy area containing native species of wet loving trees and plants like Alder, downy birch, hazel and grey willow. A raised walkway allows movement all year through this area which will be constructed locally from sustainable materials. Woodland will be coppiced to provide skills opportunities and to reduce height of the canopy



Plant a community broadleaf native woodland to enhance existing trees and infill where there are gaps

Native bulb planting where possible amongst trees and on woodland margins eg, bluebell, snowdrop, daffodil and wood anemone

All grass areas outside the regulation pitch area to be under a reduced mowing scheme. Grass areas to be identified and cut following 2 regimes:  
Meadow Cut - Cut twice a year early Spring and late Summer once flowers have seeded.  
Nectar Cut - Cut every 4-6 weeks from April to September. This allows increased pioneer wildflower species to flower, providing essential food for pollinators and a softer surface for recreation.  
All cuttings (arising) to be removed

Plant a native orchard. Mixed broadleaf, Elder, Rowan and Hazel, mixed with native local fruit species eg Bakers delicious, Cissy and Afal Anghidi, Berllan deri red and Welsh plum varieties and wild cherry

Bilingual signage and interpretation boards at entry points (orange line) to help explain the rationale behind the project and to help identify common species of wildflower and pollinators etc. A nature exercise trail sign posted along the path.

Community Woodland funded area; focused primarily on increasing biodiversity and providing opportunities for volunteering and community involvement with nature eg, planting, maintenance and harvesting. Potential project to create: 300m<sup>2</sup> orchard, 400m<sup>2</sup> broadleaf woodland; 40m new hedging, 100m refurbished hedging, 850m<sup>2</sup> wetland area, 1500m<sup>2</sup> wild flower meadow and 300m<sup>2</sup> nectar rich grassland
